About the Initiative



FARE (Food Allergy Research & Education) created the FARE Neighborhoods Initiative (FNI) to bring food allergy education and interventions directly into community settings, with a focus on underresourced

neighborhoods. Currently in seven locations across the country, FARE works with schools, community organizations, healthcare providers, places of worship, and more to raise awareness of this potentially life-threatening disease.

Each location is supported by a dedicated community health worker who ensures that outreach efforts are tailored and impactful. We help improve safety, facilitate access to resources, and enrich quality of life for individuals and families managing food allergy through the following **FREE** activities:

- Partnering with local healthcare providers to enhance allergy management support
- Providing workshops for caregivers and people with food allergy
- Training staff from schools, childcare centers, restaurants, and food assistance programs
- Attending community events to provide tools and resources
