Anaphylaxis is a life-threatening allergic reaction that must be treated with epinephrine quickly. It is important that everyone managing food allergy have access to this medication without delay.

There are two current ways that epinephrine can be prescribed: an auto-injector (needle device given into the side of the thigh) and an intranasal device (spray that is given in the nose).
